SUBJECT: Patient Care at Assisted or Independent Living Facilities Ohio Osteopathic Board of Trustees SUBMITTED BY: REFERRED TO: RESOLVED, that the following POLICY STATEMENT be deleted: WHEREAS, a growing number of elderly patients are turning to Extended Care Facilities (ECF) to assist them with their daily living; and WHEREAS, it is very difficult and time consuming to care for the complex patients in an ECF setting; and WHEREAS, the ECFs do not reimburse non medical director physicians for their time; and WHEREAS, a large percentage of these patients need assistance with transportation and many need additional assistance with mobility; and WHEREAS, current Medicare guidelines will reimburse a physician more if that patient is transported to their office versus being seen by the physician at their ECF; and WHEREAS, the voluminous phone calls from ECFs to the physicians for coordination of care are never reimbursed; and WHEREAS, having a physician go to the ECF would alleviate the burden of arranging and privately paying for transportation by the patient or their family; and WHEREAS, having the physician go to the ECF would be similar to making a house call; now therefore be it RESOLVED, that the Ohio Osteopathic Association petition the American Osteopathic Association (AOA) to encourage Medicare to (1) re evaluate their reimbursement policy to encourage more preventative care to occur at these ECFs; (2) improve reimbursement to physicians in Long Term Care Facilities and to reimburse time spent on phone calls from ECFs to physicians; and, (3) encourage caring physicians to participate in treatment of their patients at their respective Extended Care Facilities. **EXPLANATION:** This resolution was taken to the AOA House of Delegates where it was amended and approved.

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
