SUBJECT: Ohio Automated Rx Reporting System (OARRS) and HB93 Dayton (III) District Academy of Osteopathic Medicine SUBMITTED BY: REFERRED TO: WHEREAS, there is a "pain epidemic" in Ohio with increased drug diversion and abuse; and WHEREAS, many thousands of patients in Ohio have been identified by the Ohio Compassionate Care Task Force of 2007 as being under medicated for pain or as not having access to appropriate medical care for chronic pain; and WHEREAS, physicians (are committed to providing) want to provide safe, appropriate care for their patients with pain; and WHEREAS, the Ohio Automated Rx Reporting System (OARRS) was established by the Ohio State Board of Pharmacy (OSBP) to enable prescribers and distributors of controlled substances to access a database to help identify patients who are misusing or diverting substances of abuse, or who may be "doctor shopping"; and WHEREAS, Ohio House Bill 93 of the 129th General Assembly requires the OSBP to adopt rules that establish standards and procedures to be followed by physicians regarding the review of patient information available through the drug database; and WHEREAS, OOARS can help doctors feel confident that they are treating "real patients with real pain"; and WHEREAS, the OARRS is currently underutilized by primary care physicians in Ohio; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED, that Osteopathic physicians in Ohio become familiar with OARRS and utilize it in their practices; and, be it further RESOLVED, that the Ohio Osteopathic Association (OOA) play an active role in the Ohio State Medical Board (OSMB) development of regulations requiring physicians to interact with OARRS to assure that these regulations are not cumbersome and overly demanding of a physicians time; and, be it further RESOLVED, that the OOA work with the OSBP to update OARRS and improve ease of access and utilization.
