COVID-19 Updates for License Renewal	House Bill 404 extended licenses set to expire between March 9, 2020 and April 2021. Those licenses will now expire on July 1, 2021. The board encourages providers not to wait until the last minute to renew their license. Providers can view their renewal date by logging into <u>elicense.ohio.gov</u>
Physician Scam Alert	Providers should remain aware that a scam continues to target and affect Ohio prescribers. Scammers are calling, faxing, and emailing medical professionals claiming to be agents of the State Medical Board of Ohio (SMBO), agents of the DEA or agents of the FBI. These scammers claim that the professionals' medical and drug licenses have been compromised and are being used by other entities in a drug trafficking scheme. Tactics have included calling, faxing, and emailing fraudulently.
	Physicians who are contacted by a scammer should report the incident to local law enforcement and the Ohio Attorney General by filing a complaint online at <u>ohioprotects.org</u> or by calling 800-282-0515.

New Rules Effective December 31, 2020	Military rules for all license types.
Temporary Relaxation of Physician Assistant	Senate Bill 310 made the following allowances until May 1, 2021.
Supervision	 Physician assistants (PA) that are employed by or under contract with a hospital or other health care facility, may

	 practice under the direction, control, and supervision of any physician or podiatrist in that setting regardless of whether they have a supervision agreement with that physician or podiatrist. These PAs may perform services within their scope of practice, if authorized by the physician or podiatrist and the hospital or health care facility, regardless of if those services are authorized in any existing supervision agreement to which they are a party. Physicians and podiatrists practicing in a hospital or other health care facility, may (1) supervise a PA (employed by or under contract with a hospital or other health care facility) that they do not have a supervision agreement with and (2) authorize that PA to perform services are also authorized by the hospital or health care facility.
